Highlight of this very succesful evening on September 18 was the performance of "Transatlantische Stille und glückliche Fahrt" by Berlin based German composer Andreas Peer Kähler, a piece which was composed particularly for the concert at the German Consulate in New York City. This first release was welcomed by a very committed public and particularly highlighted by the presence of the three composers, Annette LeSiege, Andreas Peer Kähler and Jeff Scott. Following the Cultural Attaché Thietmar Bachmann's invitation "Ladies, this brand new floor is yours", the three charming musiciens made a wonderful concert and inaugurated this year's season with shining glamour.
